
HARRIET BEECHER STOWE IN MANDARIN

A PROPOSED SCULPTURE —

Mandarin Museum & Historical Society is thrilled to partner with acclaimed artist Brenda Mauney Councill to bring her work, "Harriet Beecher Stowe in Mandarin," to Walter Jones Historical Park. This remarkable display of public art will honor Stowe's legacy in Florida, including her advocacy for accessible and equitable education in the state following the U.S. Civil War.

Imagine this life-sized bronze sculpture of Harriet Beecher Stowe, appearing as she did while living in 1870s Mandarin, nestled in a small walking garden alongside Mandarin Museum. Imagine the St. Joseph's Mission Schoolhouse for African American Children serving as the backdrop to her interaction with two small school children. Imagine the opportunity created to interact with this rich history while surrounded by Mandarin's historic oak canopy. Imagine the value Stowe's likeness will add as the Museum continues its mission to share the stories of the community's history, culture, and natural resources.

The project has won the approval of the City of Jacksonville, Florida Communities Trust, and the Mandarin Museum & Historical Society's Board of Directors. In addition, Joan D. Hedrick, author of the 1995 Pulitzer Prize winning biography *Harriet Beecher Stowe: A Life*, has offered her endorsement stating, "it is entirely fitting that such a monument be placed there. It will celebrate one of America's most prolific and influential writers...[and] commemorate Stowe's profound love of Florida. I heartily endorse this movement to celebrate her life, work, and time in Mandarin." The proposed statue is also timely as The Florida Commission on the Status of Women recently selected Harriet Beecher Stowe as a 2023 finalist to be considered for the Florida Women's Hall of Fame.

Brenda Councill's scale model is currently on display at Mandarin Museum. Her work sculpting the full-scale piece has begun with opportunities for the public to view the process and engage with Councill as she sculpts. We anticipate its completion and installation in late 2024/early 2025. To support the project and lock in foundry costs, we have set a goal of raising \$150,000.

Be a part of this ambitious and important campaign! Donors at the \$2500 level and above will enjoy acknowledgment on a permanent plaque located near the installed sculpture as well as a private cocktail reception with Brenda Councill celebrating its unveiling.
